With the steady decline in low cost, high value support for schools, we, in the Diocese of Chichester, are pleased to be able to offer visits, reviews, mentoring, coaching and CPD opportunities across the diocese in the year 2017/2018. Of course it is only of value to those who take it up which we hope school leaders, governors and staff will do so. We know that your time is often squeezed but would urge you to carve time out to learn more yourselves and to come together with other colleagues. Remember the instruction on an aeroplane, "In the event of an oxygen failure, please put the mask over your own face before attending to others".

We are particularly keen to provide opportunities in this era of school to school support to facilitate occasions on which you can meet each other and share ideas. This is why we run RE Networks and why we are supporting the Peer Group Networks run under the auspices of the Church of England National Foundation for Education. The emphasis in our programme for this coming year is the newly articulated Church of England Vision for Education which we want to see embedded in all our schools. We shall be offering INSET days for whole staff teams and sessions for Foundation Governors in particular.

We are offering more training for governors around their employer responsibilities, focussing on what it means to be a good employer.

A number of our schools have been found wanting when it comes to safeguarding compliance and practice and so we shall be re-running sessions on this important area as well as offering compliance reviews.

The Understanding Christianity training has been very well received by those who have taken it up. We shall be doing more of the initial training in this coming year and urge all schools that have not yet accessed training to do so. If you want an arrangement other than those in the programme please ring Lesley Hurst to discuss. We shall also be offering additional training for those schools who have started the project.

We have had some very positive feedback on the Diocesan Effectiveness Partner scheme which is beginning to gain real traction. If you have paid your Partnership Agreement subscription you are entitled to two half day visits. Additional time can be bought and booked through the Diocesan Education Department.

There is no doubt that we all face a very challenging year ahead and we as a team want to help you to receive as much support as we can give. However we do need you to tell us what you need and to participate in the programme that is offered as well as requesting specific help.

As we reach the end of the Year of the Bible, the Diocese is embarking on a Year of Prayer, beginning in Advent. Please look out for details of a new competition. If we all renew our prayer life during this year, I am confident that our schools and the children in them will feel the effects.

I look forward to meeting many of you throughout next year either in your schools or at some Diocesan event or briefing. Meanwhile please make the most of the rest of the summer activities in school and a well- earned rest on holiday. Leisure is part of the fullness of the life that God has given richly to enjoy and you deserve some!

Partnership Agreement (PA) The Diocesan Board of Education (DBE) provides a range of services to support all schools within the Diocese (please see our PA brochure, published separately). One of the benefits of belonging to the PA is the significant reduction in course fees for schools attending professional development activities prepared, organised and led by the Education Team.

Payments should be submitted with the booking form - cheques should be made payable to 'Chichester DBF'.

There are 2 levels of payment

- one for schools who have paid their Partnership Agreement, indicated 'PA',
- and those who have not paid, indicated as 'NonPA'.

All fees are per delegate unless otherwise stated.

Please note all prices are currently shown exclusive of VAT. At present the Diocese does not charge VAT on services offered to schools, however, this is subject to change.

Closing date all course bookings close 2 weeks prior to the date of the event. Should you wish to book on to a course with less than 2 weeks' notice, please call us to see if places are still available. Please do not post a booking form with payment unless you have confirmation from us that this place is available.

Cancellations should you need to cancel your booking, refunds will only be given with sufficient notice. A full refund, minus £20 admin fee, will be given if you cancel at least 2 weeks in advance. A 50% refund, minus £20 admin fee, will be given if you cancel with at least a week's notice. If you cancel with less than a week's notice no refund will be given.

Minimum numbers all of our events require a minimum number of delegates in order to proceed. If, due to low numbers, we decide we are unable to run a course you will be notified by email/phone at least 5 working days in advance of the event. You will be given the option to transfer to another course or given a full refund with no administration charge. Please note that if due to unforeseen circumstances a course facilitator is unable to attend on the day, we will endeavour to engage a replacement. If, however, we are unable to find a replacement we will notify you as soon as possible.

Lunch will be provided for whole day courses. Please do notify us when booking of any special dietary requirements and/or food allergies.

CHRISTIAN DISTINCTIVENESS AND RE

'UNDERSTANDING CHRISTIANITY'

For RE Subject Leaders

The Diocese of Chichester expects that all church schools will use the Understanding Christianity resource to support high quality learning in RE within their school and will incorporate the materials into RE for the planning and teaching of Christianity.

This is the second year of running this initial training and as such we are not planning to offer initial training again in 2018-19. We therefore strongly recommend that all schools who have not completed this training ensure that they do so in this academic year.

'Understanding Christianity' is a fabulous resource which underpins the teaching and learning of Christianity from EYFS through to Year 9. The resource builds on training delivered across the Diocese in the last two years and enables teachers to 'dig deeper and linger longer' exploring the big ideas and core concepts of Christianity. The resource has been extremely well received by schools. Those who have completed the training report that it has had real impact on standards of RE within their schools. The training comprises different modules delivered as 15 hours of CPD over the course of the academic year.

TRAINER PROFILES

Ann Holt has been Diocesan Director of Education for Chichester Diocese since September 2014. Ann also serves as Director of DCAT in her capacity as DDE. Before that she was Executive Director of the Bible Society, a charity with a £15million turnover. She was also Chair of the DBE for Bristol Diocese, a Bristol MAT Director and a governor of Bristol Cathedral School Academy which she helped to transition from the independent sector. She was also a governor of Malmesbury Primary School Academy. She has been a trustee of Oasis Community Learning for 9 years and is a Director of The Tenax Trust.

Her background is in Education having taught in Jamaica, Kent and Cambridgeshire. She ran the Education Development Centre in Cambridge for 8 years where she pioneered governor development under local management of schools. She went on to be the Director of Action for Governors' Information and Training, the forerunner of the NGA. She spent three years as a special adviser at the DFE working on governor recruitment and training and developed with CFBT all the early training on governors and performance management. She has co-authored two books on governance including, with Jane Martin, *Joined –up Governance* which is still a best seller.

Ann has been a governor of various types of school for over 30 years including 8 years as Chair of an independent school in Bath. She is on numerous charity boards and was vice-chair of the Council of the University of Gloucestershire for 5 years overseeing the route to University Title.

She has been part of the group that has developed the CofE Vision for Education.

Ann was awarded the OBE for services to education in June 2004.

Ruth Cumming has been the Head of School Effectiveness and Organisation for the Diocese of Chichester for the past three years. Previously she was the headteacher of two Church of England primary schools in West Sussex, and has worked as a general adviser for West Sussex Education authority. One of her passions is developing school leadership at all levels. She co-ordinates diocesan support for governors throughout headteacher appointments across Sussex. This year Ruth has been involved with the new national Church of England Foundation for Leadership (CEFEL). Working closely with Mandy Watson, Ruth leads twelve highly skilled consultants as Diocesan Effectiveness Partners who work across our 158 schools

Mandy Watson has many years experience as a teacher and senior leader. She was a Headteacher in Sussex and at an International school in Africa, where she was a member and leader of accreditation teams for International Schools. She was an Inspector in Croydon before Ofsted came into being! She was a SIAMS Inspector in London and has just become a Critical Reader to support her management of SIAMS for Chichester Diocese. Mandy was a Link Inspector, SIP Manager and then Senior Primary Improvement Adviser for the London Borough of Greenwich for 13 years until joining the Diocese Education team as Senior Schools Improvement Adviser and SIAMS manager in 2016. She has broad experience in supporting headteachers, governors and senior leaders in all areas of school improvement and works as an external adviser for headteacher performance management. Mandy is an NLG and the Chair of Governors of a Federation. She is a Trustee of a recently formed Multi Academy Trust in London.

Sally Collins has had over 30 years work experience in the field of building construction and projects, linked to capital asset management of buildings. She has worked as Capital Asset Programme Manager for the Diocese for over 5 years. Previously in the public sector, private sector and charities. She is a History/Sociology BA Hons Graduate with qualifications in Building Construction HNC, Prince 2 Foundation, Institute of Housing, and Post Graduate Certificate in Management.

Heather Broadbent is Capital Assets Project Officer in the Education Department of the Diocese of Chichester. Heather's role is to support Sally Collins, Capital Assets Programme Manager, on all aspects of her work regarding school buildings and in the delivery of capital funding streams from the ESFA, eg.
