We have been delighted with the response to our Peer to Peer Mentoring programme for headteachers. We were very appreciative to get so many positive comments about our Headteachers' Conference on 29 March. It has been very encouraging but it has also helped us plan for next year. I would like to highlight our ongoing provision of training for SIAMS. I am sure you are aware that the new framework is demanding and it puts a strong emphasis on the distinctively Christian vision of your school. All our training for this year is now full, so please look out for the Autumn Term training on SIAMS when our brochure is published. Over the past week you will have been receiving your invoices for your Partnership Agreements with our Education Team. We are very aware of how tight your budgets are and we know how every penny counts. This year we have tried to bring in adjustments that support our Small Schools and cap the contributions from our Secondaries. Money is tight everywhere and that includes here. We are supported generously by the Diocese to carry out our statutory duties but it is your Partnership Agreements that support the work of our DEP's, the support many schools ask for during inspections, the work we have done on Small Schools and on Federations, training and conference programmes and the advisory work when schools need help when improvement issues arise. I am proud that more and more schools are turning to us for this and we acknowledge that sources of such help are harder to find. However, without your support in paying the Partnership Agreement, providing these resources would be impossible. We will do all we can to avoid turning schools away and currently we have the resources that support will begin to shrink and eventually disappear. That is enough of the 'sales pitch'! I just want you to know that your contributions do matter and are critical in equipping us. Thank you for what you have given.

Whilst the summer term brings special days and lovely weather (I hope) it is also challenging for us in many ways. Obviously we are now entering the season for testing and exams. This is the first year I have not been involved with SATS since they were introduced. These times are really challenging for you as heads and teachers and I do recognise the pressure. Please be assured of our prayers and we are here if you need us for professional help or a listening ear. However, right at the heart of this process are our children, whether they are being tested on their phonics knowledge or their A level courses. Whilst we pray for our school leaders, we must also pray for our children as they face these pressures and seek to show their capabilities.

I hope that this will be a really positive term for you all. We continue to pray for you and please do ensure you contact us if you need anything.
