# **Updates**

#### **RE Statement of Entitlement**

The Church of England Education Office produced a new RE Statement of Entitlement in February. This document is available to download from their website and from our schools' website. The new Statement is more structured and makes the expectations clearer, bringing it in line with the new SIAMS framework. Although the new Statement is not very different to the last there are a number of slight changes in wording and emphasis that you should familiarize yourself with. It is therefore important to download the statement and ensure that all members of the leadership team, including governors are familiar with it and that it is shared with all staff.

## Emmanuel Project CD – UKS2 Islam Units

As many of you will already know, following information we received from the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich, we sent details to all schools about an issue with the Emmanuel Project CD. However, it seems as though this information may not have reached some RE subject leaders! We were notified about a problem with one of the websites listed in one of the y 5/6 Islam unit. The website listed had been hacked. The advice given therefore, when using any of the links listed in any of the units of work, is to ensure that all school IT systems are kept up to date and protected and that teachers check out the links before using in class.



There are a number of new Collective Worship resources which you might be interested in.




