


# Collective Worship Resources



## Collective Worship Resources

This pamphlet is designed as a handy guide to some of the resources that can support your collective worship at this difficult time. This selection provides a range of different types of assemblies and worship. There are 'off the shelf' assemblies and worship materials which you can adapt to create your own inspiring worship, both inside and outside the classroom. Some of these materials can also be used by pupils who will still be at home. Most of the materials are free, though you may need to subscribe to some websites to access them. One or two are publications which can be purchased online.

Different materials are listed down the left-hand side of the page. I recommend looking at 'Journeying Together', A Glimpse of God's Kingdom, Prayer Materials and the Covid-19 section, which has a list of prayer stations that could be set up in classroom spaces (you may need to adapt and use as focal points rather than activities). These materials are designed for primary schools with versions for KS1 and KS2.

A worship resource created by The National Society, RSCM and the Liturgical Commission which supports the planning of CW. There are materials to create

your own worship based on the liturgical calendar and themes. You can pick and mix materials (prayers, songs, Bible readings etc) to create your own worship. There are materials for Call to Worship, Greetings, The Word of God, Engaging with worship, Response and Sending Out. You need to register to access the materials, but all materials are free to use once you have registered.




## Prayer Spaces in Schools


