	Slides 3 and 4 – Discuss with the children these images. Why are		
	the people protesting? What are they standing up for?		
	Slide 5 – 'My dear brothers, never think that some people are		
	more important than others. Suppose someone comes into your		
	church meeting wearing very nice clothes and a gold ring. At the		

same time a poor man comes in wearing old, dirty clothes. You show special attention to the one wearing nice clothes. You say, "Please, sit here in this good seat." But you say to the poor man, "Stand over there," or "Sit on the floor by my feet!" What are you doing? You are making some people more important than others. James 2: 1-4 The Bible is full of passages that explain God's design for the world he created; one of unity and where all are equal. This passage explains that in the eyes of God there is no difference between people, they are people who he lovingly created and we should follow this example by treating everyone equally.
Reflect on the I wonder questions together. Slides 6-9 – The images of these slides seek to illustrate the point, that of course all trees matter and are important, but at the moment the Rainforest is in trouble, it needs help and saving – so people's attention is on this forest more than others. Does it mean we care about the other forests less? Of course not, but the rainforest needs more help NOW! Slides 10 -16 – Tells the story of the Lost sheep
