'May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the holy spirit'

Dear Colleagues

I do hope that you had some time to rest and relax at Christmas although I am more than aware that the end of this holiday became very disrupted by wider events.

I am writing to you today at the start of another lockdown. I make no apologies in sharing a verse I have shared with you in the past 12 months but which, I think, is particularly relevant to the circumstances we face. That verse is Isaiah 41:10

'Fear not, for I *am* with you; Be not dismayed, for I *am* your God. I will strengthen you, Yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.'

As we prepare our plans for the coming weeks, I think these words have a particular resonance. For me the phrase "Be not dismayed for I am your God" stands out. As I have watched the situation worsen over the last few days, I have experienced a sense of dismay coupled with that familiar sentiment of "Here we go again!" However, I recognise that this is not the same challenge that we faced last March. At that time we had little knowledge of the virus we were facing and the sense of fear in all levels of society was obvious.

Whilst I would never be foolish enough to underestimate the challenge we have ahead of us now, we do have the enlightenment of science with us as the vaccines are being rolled out. This brings with it a hope of returning to a normal life eventually. Facing the uncertainty of the next few weeks can be balanced a little more by the hope of progress towards the management of this virus. However, as Christians we have much more. We have the knowledge that God is with us, we have the knowledge that God will strengthen us and we have the knowledge that God will help us.

Over the last few months many of us will have experienced exactly those things in the challenges we have faced. Our faith is often grown through challenges and trials and I hope that you have had some experience of that as God has demonstrated his faithfulness, love and care for you.

As schools we have carried out invaluable roles in our local communities. We have been places of stability, continuity, love, care and competency. We have achieved all this over the past nine months and we can draw on the strength of that and the experience we have learned as we move into this new phase. I do not underestimate the tiredness, the impact on morale and the challenge imposed to all in your school community but God is with us. He will strengthen us. He will help us and he will uphold us.

In the meantime, our own team returns to the way we operated in the first lockdown. Church House is largely closed and we are working remotely from each other. We have found ways of carrying this out effectively and our School Effectiveness Officers are fully available. They are busy trying to contact you all over the next few days.

Our online training programme will continue but other events such as the Headteachers Conference in March and the Leavers Celebrations are on hold as we watch the unfolding situation. We will keep you posted as time goes by.
