SIAMS – Statutory Inspections of Methodist and Anglican Schools


You may be aware that from September 2023 there will be a new SIAMS Framework. This builds on the existing schedule which remains in force for the current academic year. So no change if you are likely to be inspected before end July 2023.

Any changes of this nature are bound to raise questions and concerns. Whilst school leaders are being invited to 'Getting to Grips with SIAMS' these are not really for governors. **Virtual Sessions for Governors** will be planned and announced in the next e-bulletin.

Meanwhile Mike Simmonds is reflecting on how best to equip governors in supporting school leaders and to be the very best church schools. Key to this will be developing an understanding of the theology as well as practices that inform all that we do.

Governance Training


The programme of virtual development sessions for governors can be booked through **Eventbrite**. Information about each course can be found below. They are for **ALL** Governors.
