Our Small School, NPQ programme will:

Deepen your ability to apply leadership knowledge to address persistent and common challenges in rural and small schools securing and sustaining effective school improvement.

Create networked communities of practice with fellow professionals in similar small school settings, enabling the collective expertise of the whole education system to grow and develop.

For NPQ Small, you can select one of the following NPQ programmes:

NPQH – You are, or are aspiring to be, a headteacher or head of school with responsibility for leading a school.

NPQSL - For school leaders who are, or are aspiring to be, a senior leader with cross-school responsibilities.

NPQLBC- You have or are aspiring to have, responsibilities for leading behaviour &/or supporting pupil wellbeing.

NPQLTD - You have or are aspiring to have, responsibilities for leading the development of other teachers in their school.

NPQLT - You have or are aspiring to have, responsibilities for leading teaching in a subject, year group, key stage or phase.

Drawing on these aspects of leadership, your learning experience with the Church of England will be defined by 6 interacting principles upon which we have built the entire programme.

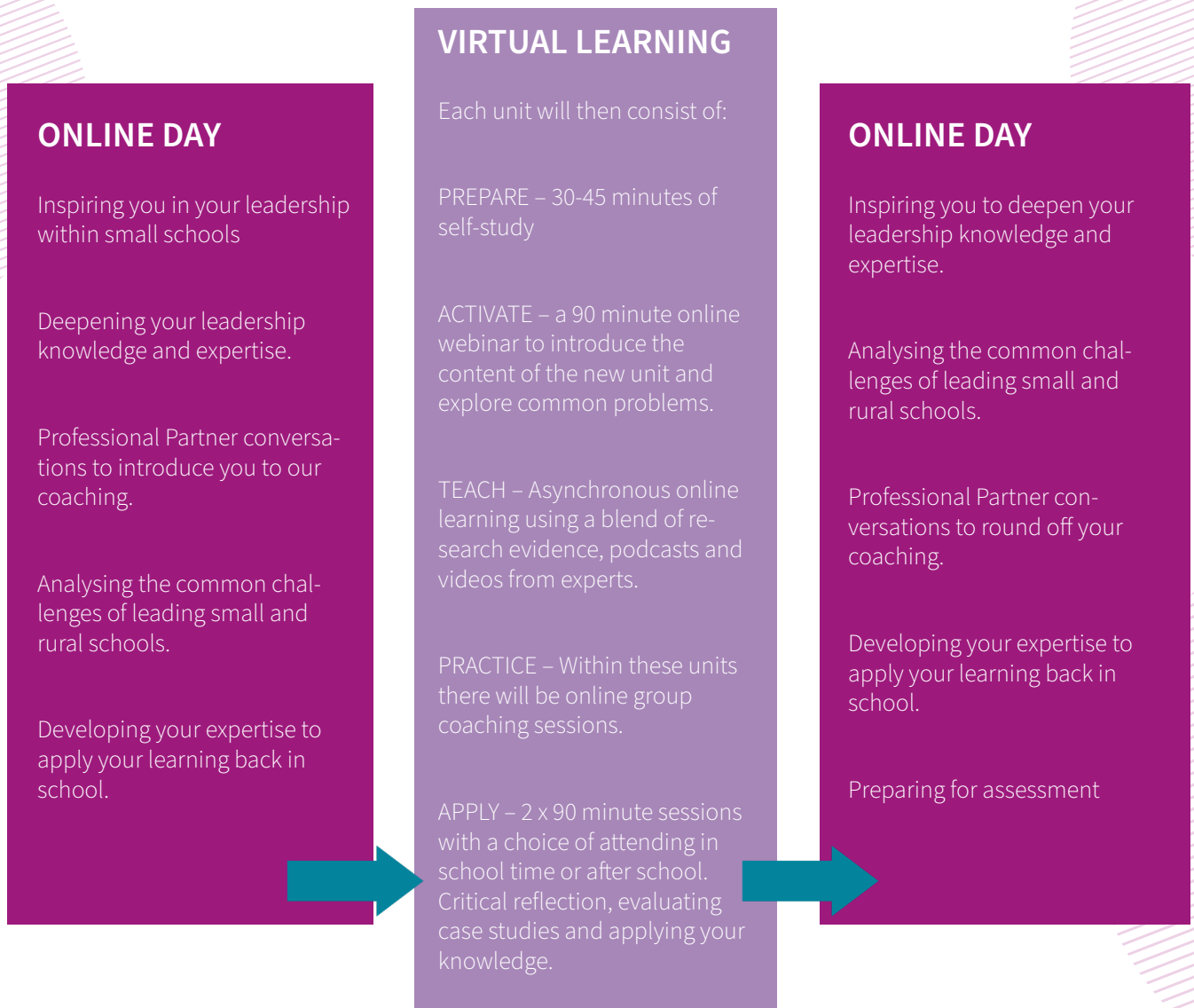
#4 An Expert Coach for Every Leader

Your expert coach will guide you through a significant proportion of the programme, enhancing your understanding of the research and supporting your practice of new skills.

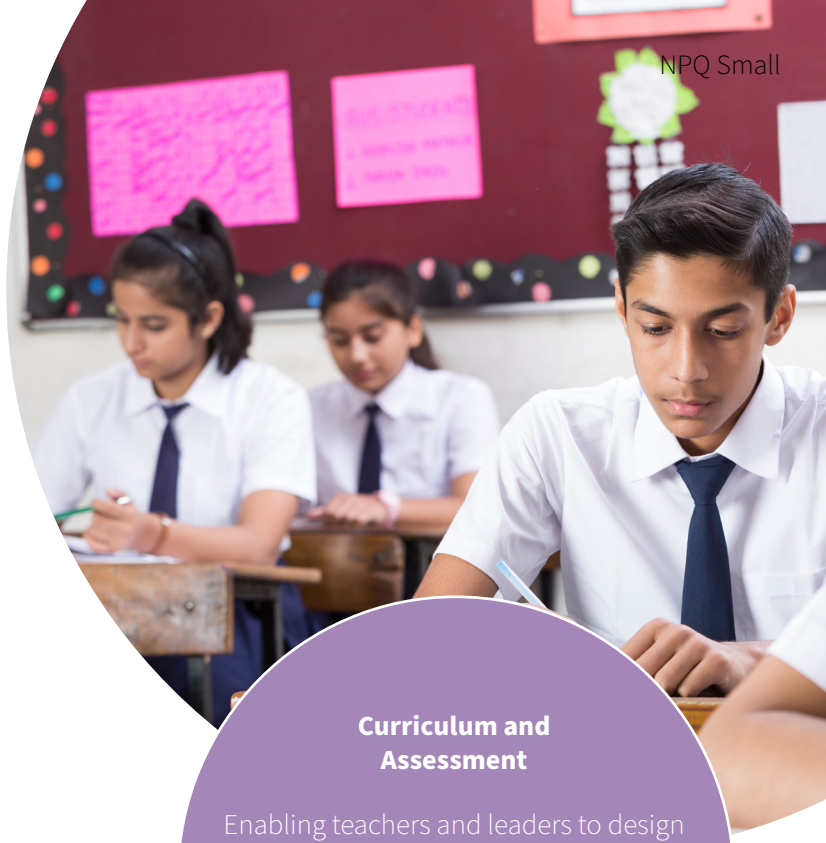
Your Learning Journey

At the start of your NPQSmall experience you'll have an online day in which you will connect with participants from small schools across the country and with your expert facilitators. Your learning will then be split into units, with each unit focusing on a key aspect of leadership knowledge, for example curriculum or professional development. These units will be comprised from a blend of asynchronous online study, webinars and coaching. At the end of the course there will be another online day. All sessions are designed with small schools in mind equipping you to apply your learning in your own context.

The content of the NPQ Small will differ depending on the programme you choose to apply for, however the focus will be on leading teacher excellence and a culture in which pupils staff and school communities can flourish. The content is tailored to support and develop leaders with the expertise to successfully lead in small and rural schools, whilst at the same time equipping you to lead across the sector.

The content of your programme

Teaching and Culture

Focusing on how small school teachers and leaders can develop teacher excellence considering the challenges of fewer staff and smaller budgets through a culture of collaboration.

Curriculum and Assessment

Enabling teachers and leaders to design a carefully sequenced curriculum which considers the needs of mixed-age classes and to use formative and summative assessment effectively to ensure children build their knowledge, skills and understanding.

Developing Effective Teachers and Leaders in Small Schools

Behaviour and Additional Needs

Equipping teachers and leaders in small schools to lead on behaviour, pupil wellbeing and provision for those with additional needs in a way that allows all pupils to flourish.

Professional Development

Allowing small school leaders to design and lead evidence-informed, collaborative and sustained professional development activities which improve teaching and curriculum expertise, set within a supportive professional environment.

Organisational Management and Partnerships (NPQH & SL)

Developing your skills to lead and manage school efficiently and effectively, dealing with the issues of small school capacity, whilst working with key partners in your school and crucially for small schools – your community.

Course Leaders

Throughout your NPQ, you will be taught by experienced facilitators through nationally delivered webinars. You will also be supported by an Expert Coach who has been trained in the Called, Connected, Committed coaching model which has been inspired by the BASIC coaching model.

Your facilitators and coaches will be experienced school leaders who are working, or have worked, in small schools, teaching school hubs, high performing Trusts or Church of England/Catholic schools. Coaches will hold a Certificate in Evidence Informed Practice from the Chartered College of Teaching and are accredited Church of England expert coaches.

Eligibility for a place on the NPQ Small Programme

To access one of our NPQ Small programmes you will need to be working in a primary school with less than 150 pupils or a secondary school with less than 800 pupils. **Primary schools with 150 or fewer pupils will receive £800 per member of staff participating in NPQSmall.**

Department For Education Scholarship Funding

Full funding is available for all NPQs for state-funded schools and state-funded 16-19 institutions in England.

Each school with less than 600 pupils will also receive a payment of £200 per participant from the DFE. This is intended to support schools with the cost of teachers attending the training.
