NPQ Opportunities

Last term, I wrote to you about the NPQ opportunities, and we are particularly excited by the NPQ Small project that is available for schools under 150. This is an opportunity to complete the NPQ training units in an innovative way and the financial support coming from the DfE to enable you to engage may not last for a long time. You can also access NPQs through our delivery partners at Bishop Luffa and Aquinas Trust and we are aware that BOAT will be working in partnership to deliver some training in the centre of the diocese too.

Further information appears elsewhere in this enews but the suite of courses include:

- NPQH for aspiring Heads
- NPQSL for aspiring senior leaders with cross-school responsibilities
- NPQLBC for those aspiring to lead behaviour and pupil well-being support.
- NPQLTD for those aspiring to lead the development of other teachers in the school.
- NPQLT for those aspiring to have responsibilities for leading teaching in a subject.


Education Sunday
